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#### SJVPGA – End of the Year bonus pool

**A points system**, will be brought back in to play this year (as have been, in the past). The format template is very similar from the past.

For each tournament, participants will earn points – based on participation in that tournament and additional points can be earned, relevant to their order of finish. The points standings will be available in our chapter link, on the NCPGA site. After each event, the point totals will be updated. An end of the year points tally, will lend itself to qualifying for some bonus money.

An "End of the year" payout will be available for the highest earning point players. "Player of the Year" honors will be drawn from the same points list. 4 players will be awarded, from that pot (40%, 30%, 20%, 10%).

7\$ from each player, will go into that fund, from each event. Top 5 gross score finishers, will get points as well as all those that participate in each given tournament, (8pts each).

Points Schedule: Tournament Participation = 8pts/per player ... in addition:

Gross finish: 
$$1^{st} = 60pts$$
 Team Finish: (per player)  $1^{st} = 20 pts$  (Individual)  $2^{nd} = 50$   $2^{nd} = 10 pts$   $3^{rd} = 40$   $4^{th} = 30$   $5^{th} = 20$ 

**For Chapter Championship,** (because it's our final and most meaningful event), the point values will be higher and will pay down to 8<sup>th</sup> place.
