V. Past President's Comments

Honorary President Dumas thanked everyone for the opportunity to serve the Membership of the Northern California PGA.

VI. PGA President – Paul Levy

President Levy asked for any questions or concerns from the Board. He then spoke about the lifelong learning strategy by the PGA of America, and the importance of education, specifically in three career paths: Teaching, Traditional Golf Professional, General Management. President Levy also reviewed the recent PGA Annual Meeting. He informed the Board that the Port St. Lucie Golf Trail and the Center for

Learning and Performance is currently for sale. A portion of the sale proceeds will be put back into the PGA Golf Club's 54-hole and practice facility. A question was asked about the future of the Education Learning Center. President Levy said the PGA is working on contingency plans for the Education Center pending a sale of the property. Director Eric Lippert asked about the PGA Certification Program. President Levy informed that the Certification Program will tie into the new lifelong learning strategy. Director Pat Jones asked if the PGA has considered having its own management company. President Levy gave a history of the discussion and pointed out that the PGA already manages two facilities in Valhalla and PGA Golf Club.

VII. District 11 Report – Scott Ashworth

Director Ashworth thanked the Board of Directors for their leadership in the last few weeks. Director Ashworth discussed the Resolutions that were brought forth at the recent Annual Meeting. The Member Assistance program resolution passed. The South Texas Life Member Tour Classification Resolution narrowly failed. The Southern California Resolution to award 6 Education Credits from golf specific colleges failed. Two new field directors were hired for Section Business Operations – Mike Ray and Josh Riley. President Levy added that the goal is to help guide Sections to become self-sustaining. Currently, nearly \$20million is distributed back to the Sections.

IX. President's Report – Bill Troyanoski

- 1. Action Item and Request Log President Troyanoski asked Director Sutton to discuss the Chapter President's Meeting that was held prior to the Board Meeting. Discussion at the Chapter President's meeting included participation, sponsors, expectations of Chapter Presidents, having a Chapter Manual in place, and more requirements implemented at the Chapter level. Director Jones added that a goal of the Chapters would be to encourage Members and Apprentices that education is important for their future success, not just a means to acquire MSR Credits. Director Winiecki discussed the new "Gloria Armstrong Diversity and Inclusion Award", and the first award will be presented to Gloria Armstrong at the Semi-Annual Meeting.
- 2. **PGA Annual Meeting** President Troyanoski reviewed the recent PGA Annual Meeting, encouraged the Board to drive attendance to the 2018 Annual Meeting which will be in Indian Wells (Southern California).
- 3. **2018 Board of Director Schedule** President Troyanoski mentioned the possibility of a Board Retreat in the future for Board development.
- 4. **Hall of Fame Update** Honorary President Dumas thanked everyone for their support of the Section Hall of Fame. A letter/email will be sent to the Membership in January to introduce the Hall of Fame.
- 5. **2020 PGA Championship** President Troyanoski reported that the Section officers met with the Gateway Section regarding the hosting of a PGA Championship in preparation for the 2020 Championship at TPC Harding Park.

6. **Staff Update** – President Troyanoski thanked Nancy Maul and the Staff for their hard work on the preparations for the Annual Meeting and the Budget.

X. Vice President's Report – Dede Moriarty

Vice President Moriarty thanked the Finance Committee for their assistance and support. Vice President Moriarty reviewed 2017 and indicated a 4% negative variance to budget, equating to \$58K. There were three factors for this: 1) G&A unforeseen expenses, including staff overtime, auto repairs, revenue shortfalls, and sponsor shortfalls. 2) Marketing — Business Development 3) PGA Tour Qualifiers — suffered a loss in Q4, due to a reduction in field size and low participation. Interim Executive Director Maul gave a review of the 2018 budget forecast, including:

- -Annual Cost of Living adjustment for staff
- -Fixed costs increase about 12%/year
- Workforce adjustment (should be a \$34K savings)
- -No ED salary in Q1 will help bottom line
- -Player Development help (Nikki Gatch) will alleviate some workload from Brian
- -Business Development position will provide opportunity to increase revenue
- Tournaments need to replenish \$16K; will increase tournament admin fee from 11% to 14% in 2018.
- -Member Dues increase of 2% (will equate to a \$4K increase)
- -2018 Budget planned for a surplus of \$23K
- -Feedback from all Board Members is requested by Monday, December 11, and the final Budget Meeting will be held on December 18, via a conference call at 10:30am.

Attached you will find detailed financial statements for the year ending December 31, 2017. These reports are created by PGAHQ and are provided for your review.

Balance Sheet (page 1): The Section finished the year with \$373,507 in total liabilities and net assets. This is a \$38,899 less than the prior year. The Loan Receivable (Section Reserves) at \$249,355 is \$31,327 less than the prior year.

Section Only Activities (page 2): Section only activities experienced a deficit of \$21,473 excluding depreciation, \$36,707 better than forecast of December 14, 2017 (see detailed by Line of Business).

1. Significant Accounting Policies

Principles of Consolidation

The combined financial statements include the financial statements of the Northern California Section of The PGA, ("The Northern California Section", a 501(c)(6), non-profit, tax-exempt organization), and its chapters (San Joaquin Chapter, North State Chapter, Sierra Nevada Chapter, North Coast Chapter, Monterey Chapter, and Bay Area Chapter), Assistants Division, Women's Division, and Seniors Division. All significant intercompany balances and transactions have been eliminated.

The Northern California Section operates membership programs through its Divisions and Chapters. A division and a chapter are regional groups of members. Divisions consist of the Assistants Division, Women's Division and the Seniors Division. Chapters consist of Northern State Chapter, Sierra Nevada Chapter, North Coast Chapter, Bay Area Chapter, Monterey Chapter and San Joaquin Chapter. Some volunteers assist the divisions and chapters under the direction of the Northern California Section.

Affiliated Party

The Northern California Section is chartered by The PGA of America. Under The PGA of America's constitution, all members of The PGA of America must belong to both the National Association and the local Section. The PGA of America is a separate 501(c)(6) organization. The PGA's governance system is designed so that the 41 sections, including the Northern California Section, select the Board of Directors for the National Association.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from tournaments is recognized when the event takes place. Revenue from member dues is recognized ratably during the year to which it relates. Revenue from all other activities is recognized at the time goods or services are provided.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation of property and equipment is determined on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of the assets are as follows:

Deferred Revenue and Prepaid Expenses

Revenue received in advance of an event is deferred until such time as the event takes place. Costs incurred relating to such events are similarly recorded as prepaid expenses and later recognized with the related revenues.

Income Taxes

The Northern California Section of the PGA is exempt from federal and state income tax for activities related to its respective tax-exempt purposes. Provision for unrelated business income tax, when applicable, is made for activities unrelated to the stated tax-exempt purposes of the entities.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

2. Section Loan Program

The Section has loaned funds to The PGA of America on a short-term basis. Interest on this loan accrues at a fixed rate that is adjusted quarterly by The PGA of America. The loan can be called in whole or in part by the Section on the first day of each calendar quarter. At December 31, 2017 and 2016, the Section's outstanding receivable under this loan totaled \$249,355 and \$280,682, respectively.

Attached you will find detailed financial statements for the month ending January 31, 2018.

Balance Sheet (page 1): The Section ended January 31, 2018 with \$387,057 in Total Liabilities and Net Assets. This is a \$122,333 more than the prior year. The Loan Receivable (Section Reserves) at \$159,355 is \$28,673 more than the prior year. The increase in Loan Receivable is a result of temporary staff reductions during year end 2017; additionally, a smaller loan transfer was required in January to provide cash flow for the first half of 2018.

Section Only Activities (page 2): Section only activities experienced an operating surplus of \$9,817 better than budget. Education Seminar 1 (Player Teacher Forum) experienced a net surplus due to increased sponsorship; additionally, NCPGA CONNECT reflects the CIG partnership which was renewed in January and was not budgeted. G&A had a negative variance of \$3,505, largely due to timing issues for recruitment expense (\$875), Bluegolf & Processing fees (\$795), Telecom (\$568) & Insurance (\$976).

Chapter and Divisions (page 2): Experienced a surplus of \$5,305.







REGIONAL LEAGUE MANAGER REPORT

NIKKI GATCH, PGA

PGA Junior League is in full swing! We surpassed our anticipated number of Captain registrations at 84 (as of February 11). This is already a 20% increase in the number of Captains from 2017.

Here is a snapshot of the current Captain, team and league counts for the Section, as well as comparisons to 2017:

Anticipated Section Remuneration: \$14,868 (\$10.50 per player)

New enhancements this year include improved Team Kits, unique Team Online Stores (Captains/Facilities receive net proceeds from sales), improved Post Season, including a Section Championship.

The Post Season will now consist of a Section Championship (to include local qualifers for larger Sections like Northern California), 12 Regional Championships (increase from 8), and the National Championship. In addition to the Section Remuneration mentioned above, the Section will also receive funding (\$21,000) from National Car Rental to be used in administering the Section Championship (and subsequent qualifiers).

We are currently securing two local qualifiers as well as the Section Championship. To date, the Northern Qualifier has been confirmed for August 12 at The Ridge. Proposals have been sent to Coyote Creek for the Southern Qualifier on August 4, and Contra Costa for the Section Championship on August 18-19. We will have the qualifiers and Championship confirmed prior to April 1, so that the information can be shared with Captains and their teams.

The Northern California Section Champion will advance to the Western Regional, along with Southern California, Aloha, and the Southwest Sections. The Western Regional will be held on September 15-16, site TBD. Champions from each of the 12 Regional Championships will advance to the National Championship on November 14-19 at Grayhawk Golf Club in Scottsdale, AZ.
