












Executive Director/ COO's Report

Revenue Analysis

Operating results for the 10-month period ended October reflect a YTD net

operating income of \$59,862. Compared to the budget net operating income of \$32,206, the variance is a positive \$28,000. As we ended the year, the ebbs and flows stabilized, evidenced by the on-budget variances in the Section Meetings, General and Administrative, Allied Association, Communications and Membership categories.

2019 in summary

The Section is in a much different place now than where we were one year ago, when our President, Dede Moriarty, was at the top of our leadership as our lone wolf officer. Bill Troyanoski took the reigns as our District 11 Director and hit the ground running, thank you Bill. 

NCPGA Members and Associates enjoyed a successful Annual Meeting at Green Valley Country Club. It was also an honor



• CEO Seth Waugh discussed:

- A promising outlook for a deferred compensation plan for our members and addressed healthcare.
- The exciting launch of digital platform PGA.com.
- Our strong championships that continue to grow the game and serve members.
- Our partnerships are strong and expanding globally; recent agreements include Aon and BMW.

• President Suzy Whaley discussed:

- The importance of playing the game among our leadership.
- Focusing on growing the game and connecting with as many students as possible.
- The first PGA Women's Cup in 2019; she captained the women's team to victory October 22 – 26 in Austin, Texas.

• Vice President Jim Richerson provided:

An overview of the fiscal year 18B ending on March 31, 2019, indicating that ADP funding was \$160,000 in 2018/2019 and future funding currently will be tied to CPI.

• Secretary John Lindert discussed:

- A membership update and PGA's commitment to assisting with career development.
- PGA Members serving as general managers have grown from 1,591 in 2009 to 2,694 in 2019.
- Recent advancements in the Lifelong Learning platform and new online programs like Nextgengolf, focused on recruiting future associates.

Delegates approved Resolution 1 by 114 – 1, removing the Citizenship/Residency/Work Status clause from the Bylaws, enabling the PGA to be a stronger and more inclusive Association. Also approved was Resolution 2 by 110 – 5: "Eligibility for the Life Member-Active Classification," declaring that to transfer to the this classification, all otherwise eligible Members must have completed the entrance level of PGA Education.

The PGA of America is on an exciting path and leadership's commitment to the PGA Member is of the highest priority. Our heartfelt thoughts and prayers continue to go out to all our family impacted by the California wildfires.

What Are They Up To?

Your support of the Langley Scholarship Fund has made an incredible difference in the lives of student athletes. Following is just one story of success among many.

2014 Jim Langley Scholarship Winner Megan Conder

After graduating from Heritage High School in Brentwood, California, I began college as a student athlete at the University of Oregon. I continued my work with the First Tee through the Portland Chapter as my part in giving back. I pursued my golf game, competed and adjusted to life as a college student.

Unfortunately, during my freshman year I seriously injured my ankle. After multiple surgeries, I was in a cast and then a boot for some time, and required a great deal of physical therapy. At that point I had no idea how long I would not be able to play.

For any athlete, this is a pivotal moment in their life. But although extremely difficult, I was very fortunate in a different way. This injury took me down a path that was very instrumental in my life. As an Art History major as well as an athlete, I enrolled in a class called Art of the Athlete, which greatly helped me to deal with the mental challenge of not playing my sport.

I became quite involved with the class, soon assisting with its teachings and helping other athletes who needed a safe setting aside from sports, as I totally understood the hardship of injuries. My very first project was working with a shooting victim from the Umpqua community college nearby. This began it all, and I am always grateful for each day.

While continuing my rehabilitation and therapy, I carried on working with the Art department and the University of Oregon's art museum. I assisted with many Art Education projects and travels to Paris and Italy. I worked with athletes as well as small children, memory care patients, and PTSD patients with Art therapy projects at our museum and nearby centers. During the summer, I worked exclusively as associate director for Art of the Athlete, assisting classes and coordinating our Art therapy work with high-risk youth in Seattle, Washington.

This job allowed me to not only travel and meet people all over the world, but also to touch lives in a very special way. Assisting with the program's global education, I again traveled to Paris as a 2018 graduate with my Art History degree!

After graduation, my golf game was becoming quite solid. I began to see glimmers back to where it was so long ago. I gave myself a good year of not only working with museum projects, but also working daily on my game. I was now physically strong, mentally strong and ready to go back on the course as a competitor.

I have worked very hard and look forward to playing at a whole new level. I am confident not only in my game, but also in myself. I have grown so much in the last five years and each step, or hurdle, has been a building block to my foundation as a person, and as an athlete. At this time, I have begun my journey as a golfer on tour, and am 100% committed to my golf game as my career. I thank you for believing in me and your support for us all.





The Northern California Section of the PGA is proud to honor Eric Lippert of Pebble Beach Golf Links with the 2019 Golf Professional of the Year Award. This award honors the professional whose total contributions to the game best exemplify the complete PGA Prof essional. Since he became a Class A Member in 2007, Lippert has sought

avenues of involvement with the Section. With a goal to be a consummate representative of the PGA, he settled on four important principles.

First is teaching and playing ability. Recognizing the importance of knowledge of and expertise in playing the game, he understood that the ability to teach the game is a skill that takes time to develop. And teaching in close one-to-one sessions builds relationships. Second is community service and volunteerism. He knew that successful professionals championed causes within their communities and realized that nothing is more rewarding than giving back and making a difference in the community. Third is integrity. Lippert says that by definition, integrity means adherence to moral and ethical principles. Honesty is paramount in building relationships with customers, peers and business partners. Fourth is mentoring. He says that a passion for the job will always show in your work and it will be contagious to others. Inspire those you work with ... and deepen bonds with your customers.

Lippert feels that his commitment to these principles has given him experiences beyond his imagination, including competing in a major

championship and representing his country as a player and a coach. Lippert knows that a great leader is one who recognizes how to discover talented people. He then sets them up for success ... and gets out of their way. His leadership is built on fairness and honesty and by making morally and ethically principled decisions.

Lippert has served the Section as a member of the NCPGA Board of Directors and is currently Secretary of the Board. He is a member of the Education Committee and is liaison to the 2020 PGA Championship. He held officer positions at the Chapter level as well.

Through his passion to deliver excellence to all, Lippert inspires fellow golf professionals, including guests and employees alike. His passion for the game and the business drives him toward self-improvement and the desire to deliver on all promises. He appreciates sharing the pure joy of someone experiencing Pebble Beach for the first time. Whether it's a customer, a new employee, or an intern, he is motivated to see that their experience is all they have dreamed about. By focusing on the experience of others, it helps him stay inspired and motivated to keep things fresh. He has been known to remind the staff to take a moment to look around and remember where they are.

At the end of each year, Lippert contemplates what he can do to further his experience ... to improve ... to be impactful. He takes on new challenges, one personal and one professional, developing them with the sole intent of adding to his personal betterment—and the betterment of the Professional Golfers Association. Operation 36 program, where students start at 25 yards and must shoot 36 to advance to the next five distances. His wedge clinics and putting and green-reading clinics help students maximize their short games. Always, Kelly keeps the instruction simple and consistent. He goes into local public schools with the SNAG program for younger students, and also works with local high school players for individual and group lessons. For the past 15 years, he has written a weekly golf article for the *Auburn Journal*. Kelly is a director on the NCPGA Board and liaison for the Tournament Committee. He competes regularly in Section tournaments. More than 20 of Kelly's former students have received golf college scholarships and a few of his junior golfers have gone on to become PGA Professionals. Sincere congratulations to Shawn Kelly, our NCPGA Player Development Award winner.






Sales Representative of the Year Mark Attebery


